


Over 20,000 acres of historical, natural, and recreational treasures

- 184.5 miles of towpath for walking and cycling from the District of Columbia to Cumberland, MD, connecting to the Great Allegheny Passage in Pittsburgh, PA.
- Park Visitor Centers are located along the length of the canal.




The Park preserves and protects over 1,300 historic structures, each serving as a reminder of the significance of the C&O Canal in our nation's early transportation history. The C&O Canal is one of the most biologically diverse parks, with over 100 rare, threatened, and endangered plant species.

To date, seven historic lockhouses along the C&O Canal towpath have been restored and are available to guests for interpretive overnight stays. Each lockhouse sleeps up to eight people and has been furnished to depict different time periods in the Canal's history.
